

REMOTE DUTY SUITABILITY SCREENING

SUITABILITY SCREENING is a tool used to identify medical, dental, educational, and other possible duty limiting factors or needs for both service members and family members.

- Key West is a remote duty assignment, and requires remote duty suitability screening, as stated in your orders.
- Navy and Marine Corps service members and family members must complete an accurate and thorough suitability screening, before coming to Key West.

WHY IS SUITABILITY SCREENING REQUIRED BEFORE COMING TO KEY WEST?

- Key West has **VERY LIMITED** and **INCONSISTENT** medical, dental, and education **SERVICES** — this includes routine services such as prenatal care.
- Most **SPECIALTY SERVICES** are in Miami — an **8 HOUR DRIVE** round trip and have a **6 MONTH TO 1 YEAR WAIT LIST** for appointments.

LIMITED ACCESS TO CARE = POOR OUTCOMES!

Incomplete or inaccurate screening of service members or family members result in **INCREASED ABSENCES** from work or school, **DECREASED QUALITY OF LIFE, INCREASED EXPENSES**, increased strain on local resources, and **RELOCATION/REASSIGNMENT**.
